Taxes and fuel charges totaling **\$721 USD** comprised of **\$390.60** for fuel charges (subject to airline increase up to 30-days before departure) and **\$330.40** for taxes (including U.S. federal inspection fees, airport taxes international air transportation tax, agricultural tax, other government-imposed fees such as the September 11th Security fee up to \$10 per person, passenger facility charges up to \$18 per person, federal domestic flight segment fees up to \$3.50 per segment and U.S. and International arrival and departure, and other government imposed fees up to \$300 per person).

NOT INCLUDED IN PRICE:

Passports, visas, vaccinations (if required), laundry, lunches not on the tour menu (food outside of the contracted menu will be billed prior to leaving the hotel or restaurant), excursions not listed, telephone/international data, mini-bar, alcohol, other beverages, airport transfers on non-qualifying flights, portage at airports, excess baggage fees, additional airline fees after registration, travel insurance, and all other items not explicitly mentioned.

PAYMENTS & FEES:

A non-refundable deposit of \$500 per person is due upon registration, with a second deposit of \$500 per person required within 21 days thereafter.

Credit cards are only accepted for the initial \$500 deposit; subsequent payments must be in check, ACH transfer, bill payment, or wire transfer; **all payments are required in US Funds**

Final payment is due no later than 120 days prior to departure.

Registrations after 120 days require full payment and may incur a \$300 late fee if received 119-90 days before departure. **Failure to make final payment by 90 days prior to departure results in automatic cancellation, forfeiture of the \$500 deposit, and potential additional fees.**

Imagine Tours and Travel, LLC (hereafter referred to as *imagine*) reserves the right to impose a surcharge if the dollar declines by more than 2% against the destination currency based on booking date (10/01/25).

GROUP SIZE & SUPPLEMENTS:

Tour pricing assumes a **minimum group size of 20 passengers.**

Smaller groups may incur supplements:

- \$150 per person (19-16 travelers)
- \$195 per person (15-14 travelers)
- \$295 per person (13-12 travelers)

Tours with fewer than 12 travelers may be canceled due to insufficient participation.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

Price is based on double occupancy (two people sharing a room). Single rooms may be smaller than double rooms and, when available, incur **an additional supplemental charge of \$1,175 for the basic itinerary.** Roommates are assigned if available; otherwise, single-room occupancy may apply. *Roommates may be assigned as late as 120 days prior to departure when applicable.*

ITINERARY & CHANGES:

imagine reserves the right to adjust itineraries due to airline schedule changes. Changes requiring extra nights incur \$195 per person per night (\$295 for single rooms). You will be notified in writing of said changes when possible. Meals for additional overnights are not included. Changes and/or deviations from the program and/or departure city listed by the passenger must be provided in writing no later than 120 days prior to departure. **All deviations are subject to a \$250 administrative fee** plus applicable airline fees. **All tours are made final at 90 days prior to departure.** **No changes (including additions) may be made after this time.**

LAND ONLY:

Land Only price is \$4,532 per person, excluding international flights. Land Only passengers may be responsible for transfers and/or additional overnights incurred by booking their own flights. Passengers changing from the regular tour (with group airfare) to Land Only after 120 days prior to departure will be charged a fee of \$195 per person.

AIRLINE TICKETS & SEATING:

Flight routing is at the sole discretion of the airline, not *imagine*. *imagine* does not guarantee passengers will be on the most direct flight or flying together to the final destination (especially prior to 120 days of departure). Flights are economy class on IATA/ARC carriers with non-refundable, non-amendable tickets for groups of 10 or more. Due to group rates, *imagine* does not participate or allow passengers to use points, miles, or other airline-related

offerings on group contracted airfare. Seating requests are at the discretion of the applicable airline and cannot be guaranteed. All requests, including seating, dietary restrictions, and/or all other accommodations must be made in writing prior to 120 days of departure. Airline changes, if allowable, made by the passenger after 120 days prior to departure will incur additional fees. Individual ticketing fees/deposits may apply in certain situations. **These fees can be up to \$2,000 per person and will be applied to your final balance.**

FLIGHT TIMES:

All flight times are subject to change without notice. *imagine* is not liable for expenses resulting from flight delays or changes. If making your own flight arrangements to a departure city or any other portion of your trip, we recommend obtaining a ticket which can be changed without large penalties. All passengers are responsible for reconfirming their flights with the airline 24 hours prior to departure.

PASSPORTS & VISAS:

Passengers must ensure their **passports are valid for at least six months beyond the return date of their trip** and submit a valid passport copy to our office no later than 120 days prior to departure. Visa requirements vary by country, and it is each passenger's responsibility to obtain necessary visas prior to travel. ***imagine* is not liable for obtaining any required travel visas.**

TRIP RESCHEDULING:

imagine and/or the group leader/organization reserves the right to reschedule the trip to **future dates and/or a different destination** due to governmental action, pandemics, wars, or other circumstances beyond their control. Travelers unable to travel on the new dates or to the updated destination may transfer to another tour within one year of the original travel dates, subject to fees of up to \$300 per person, plus any applicable fees imposed by ground operators, airlines, or other vendors.

CANCELLATION FEES:

Passengers cancelling from the day of registration up to 121 days prior to departure **will be charged a \$500 administrative fee** plus any airline penalties, if applicable. If passenger cancellation forces a roommate into a single room, the canceled passenger may be charged their single room fee. **↓**

In the event *imagine* cancels the tour due to insufficient participation, a \$200 administrative fee per passenger will be deducted from any applicable refund, plus any airline penalties.

Changes to the tour cannot be made within 90 days of departure, as the tour is considered closed at that time.

The ITINERARY

Day 1 – Monday, March 8: Depart U.S.A.

Tour members meet for our flight to Israel. After dinner is served, it's time to sit back, relax, and enjoy the on-board entertainment to prepare for this exciting adventure of a lifetime.

Day 2 – Tuesday, March 9: Arrive in Tel Aviv

In Tel Aviv, we proceed through customs and security and meet our guide who assists us to our motor coach. We have a short drive to our hotel in Netanya in time for our dinner and overnight.

Day 3 – Wednesday, March 10: Caesarea, Megiddo, Mt. Carmel, Nazareth, Galilee

This morning, we depart for the Galilee to visit Biblical sites at Caesarea Maritima, where Peter proclaimed the Good News to the Roman Centurion (Acts 10). We also see Megiddo and Mt. Carmel, where Elijah confronted the prophets of Baal (1 Kings 18). Time permitting, we'll stop at the Druze Village for a short lunch break (not included). Then we continue to Nazareth (Jesus' childhood home) and the Mt. of Precipitation. We then arrive in Tiberias for dinner and overnight near the Sea of Galilee.

Day 4 – Thursday, March 11: Galilee, Mt. of Beatitudes, Capernaum, Boat Ride, Bethsaida, Jordan River

Nothing compares to watching the sun rise over the Sea of Galilee! We begin today at Tabgha (the traditional site of the feeding of the 5000) and the Church of the Primacy of St. Peter. We then spend time reflecting and worshipping at the Mt. of Beatitudes and then head to Capernaum, Jesus' base for His early ministry. Afterwards, we board a replica wooden "Jesus Boat" to set sail on the Sea of Galilee. For those interested, our lunch stop includes the option of ordering the special St. Peter's Fish (not included). After lunch, we head to Gadara and Bethsaida (time permitting) before making our way to the Jordan River. Dinner and overnight are back in Tiberias.

Day 5 – Friday, March 12: Golan Heights, Caesarea Philippi, Tel Dan, Gideon Springs (pending on time availability), Beit Shean, Jerusalem

After breakfast, we travel north to the Golan Heights for a beautiful view of northern Israel's landscape. Then we will head to Caesarea Philippi where Peter confessed, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God" (Matthew 16:13-16). We embark on a short hike to Tel Dan to see the altar of Jeroboam before heading to Gideon Springs. Next, we visit Beit Shean, one of the best-preserved Decapolis Roman cities. This is where King Saul and his sons' bodies were hung from the city walls after being defeated by the Philistines (1 Samuel 31:10-12). Finally, we ascend to the majestic city of Jerusalem in time for dinner and overnight. "I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord.' Our feet are standing within your gates, O Jerusalem" (Psalm 122:1-2 NASB).

Day 6 – Saturday, March 13: Qumran, Ein Gedi, Masada, Dead Sea For Swim/Float

After breakfast, we drive to Qumran, the settlement of the first century sect the Essenes, authors of the Dead Sea Scrolls. From here, we head to Ein Gedi where David hid from King

Saul. We then travel south along the western shore of the Dead Sea toward Masada where we ascend by cable car up to King Herod's astonishing fortress. Afterwards, we make a special stop at the Dead Sea (the lowest spot on earth) for a short swim or float. Time and conditions permitting, we'll include a visit to Qasr El-Yahud, the newly excavated site where tradition holds that Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist. If possible, we will also include a short visit to Jericho. Dinner and overnight are again in Jerusalem.

Day 7 – Sunday, March 14: Mt. of Olives, Palm Sunday Road, Garden of Gethsemane, Rabbinical Tunnel, Western Wall, Southern Steps

We begin today on the beautiful Mt. of Olives to behold the famous, breathtaking panorama of the Holy City. Our pilgrimage proceeds down the Old Palm Sunday Road to the ancient olive grove at the Garden of Gethsemane. Then we continue to the Church of the Agony (Church of All Nations) where tradition says Jesus prayed before his arrest. We enter Jerusalem through the Zion Gate and proceed to the Western (Wailing) Wall, the holiest site in Judaism. We now head underground to walk through the Tunnel excavations along the Temple Mount. Afterwards, we make our way to St. Stephen's Gate to see St. Anne's Crusader Church, the Pools of Bethesda, the Pavement (where Jesus stood while being tried by Pilate), Ecce Homo Arch, and the ancient Cardo. We conclude our day with a short walk to the original steps that Jesus climbed as he entered the Temple area, the Southern Steps. We have dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 8 – Monday, March 15: Yad Vashem, City of David, Hezekiah's Tunnel, Pool of Siloam, Garden Tomb

This morning, we visit Yad Vashem, the Holocaust Memorial. We then drive to the City of David and afterwards, take a short walk to Hezekiah's Tunnel (conditions permitting). Be sure to bring a flashlight and water shoes to walk through the tunnel. Anyone wanting to stay dry can walk through Hezekiah's shaft. If time permits, we will visit the newly excavated Pool of Siloam. We end our day in worship at Golgotha and the Garden Tomb. Dinner and overnight are in Jerusalem.

Day 9 – Tuesday, March 16: Jerusalem, Temple Mount, Israel Museum, Elah Valley, Jaffa, Farewell Dinner

This morning, we begin with a visit to the Temple Mount where lies the 35-acre temple area purchased by King David (2 Samuel 24:18-25). This area is the third holiest shrine in Islam, housing both the El-Aqsa Mosque and the magnificent Dome of the Rock. From the temple area, we drive to the Shrine of the Book Museum to see the Dead Sea Scrolls and the fascinating 1:50 scale model of Jerusalem as it would have appeared in Jesus' time. We depart for the Elah Valley to see the brook where David slew Goliath. From there, we continue our drive to Jaffa. We return to Jerusalem for our last overnight and Farewell Dinner.

Day 10 – Wednesday, March 17: Ben Gurion Airport

In the morning, we transfer to Ben Gurion Airport for our flight back to the U.S.A. We arrive back in the U.S.A. same day. At the close of an unforgettable tour, we take home wonderful memories of the Old and New Testament, a renewal of our faith, and a greater understanding of the life of our Lord.

Day 10 – Wednesday, March 17: Tel Aviv, Tel Be'er Sheva, Abraham's Well, Mamshit, Big Crater

After breakfast, we depart Tel Aviv and drive south to the national park of Tel Beer Sheva, featuring the ruins of an Israelite Kingdom fortified administrative city. This ancient city is located between the Be'er Sheva and Hebron streams. The Bible associated the acts of Abraham and Isaac to the name of the city, which reads in Hebrew as the "well of the oath" or "seven wells". We have a short drive to the city of Be'er Sheva to see Abraham's Well. Then we continue via the town of Dimona to Mamshit. Mamshit National Park contains the remains of a Nabatean city from Roman and Byzantine times. Here, Nabatean architecture is presented in all its glory, against the desert backdrop of the northern Negev hills. Then we drive via the big crater, a unique geological phenomenon with beautiful colored sand, to Mt. Avnun for an amazing panoramic view over the Big Crater. We have a short drive to the small town of Yerucham for dinner and overnight.

Day 11 – Thursday, March 18: Yerucham, Sde Boker, Avdat, Mitzpe Ramon, Eilat

After breakfast, we drive to Sde Boker to visit the Ben Gurion hut. When David Ben-Gurion resigned as Prime Minister, he retired to a hut built especially for him. The hut has been preserved just the way it was when David and Paula Ben-Gurion lived there. A display has been set up at the adjacent barracks, describing Ben-Gurion's special connection to the Negev and lighting the figure of a leader who lived up to his principles. We proceed to his grave with amazing panoramic view of Zin Valley. We then continue to the national park of Avdat. In the heart of the desert on a hilltop above the Tsin Stream watercourse are the impressive remains of an ancient Nabatean city. We will then stroll to see the archeological ruins. We proceed south to the small town of Mitzpe Ramon to see the Ramon Crater. Afterwards, we drive along the Negev desert and Arava Valley to Eilat. Dinner and overnight will be in Eilat.

Day 12 – Friday, March 19: Eilat, Petra, Eilat

After breakfast, we will transfer to the Arava border crossing where we will meet our guide. Driving through the wonderful mountainous landscape of Jordan, we arrive at the world-famous Petra ruins. Here, we will walk through the narrow canyon and see its great monuments, such as the Treasury, Roman Theater, and Royal Tombs. At the end of the day, we will drive back to the border crossing and return to our hotel in Eilat for dinner and overnight.

Day 13 – Saturday, March 20: Eilat, Timna, Tel Arad, Jaffa

After breakfast, we depart from Eilat and drive north to visit Timna Park, the copper mines that once were the economic gateway to ancient Israel. We climb up Solomon's Pillars in this magnificent desert scene. We also see a reconstruction of the ancient Tabernacle that the Israelites built while wandering the desert for 40 years. We proceed along the Arava Valley to visit the national park of Tel Arad, which had a large Canaanite town despite its harsh surroundings. On top of Tel Arad is a fortress with many layers of history. The highlight is the well-preserved Israelite Temple and corresponding Holy of Holies. We drive north to Jaffa, the home of Scripture about Jonah and Peter. We will enjoy our last dinner and overnight at our hotel in Tel Aviv.

Day 14 – Sunday, March 21: Ben Gurion Airport, Arrive Home

This morning, we transfer to Ben Gurion Airport for our departure flight back home. We arrive home same day.

While we do our best to ensure that all items listed in your itinerary are included, there are times when conditions beyond our control may affect your program or itinerary, including but not limited to air carrier changes, delays, weather, political climate, time constraints, or changes made by your tour leader and tour guide.
